

Drop-in sessions so public can help grow Corangamite's agricultural future

Corangamite residents are invited to meet Council's Grow Corangamite team and discuss the future of farming in the Shire.

Council is preparing the 'Grow Corangamite: Sustaining our Agriculture Future' study to cement the Shire's position as a significant agricultural producer and food manufacturer.

Cr Geraldine Conheady is Chair of the Project Reference Group which-along with Council's project team-has prepared a background report.

"Three community 'drop-in' sessions will be held so residents can discuss the project, get further information, and provide us with your thoughts on agricultural land in the Shire," Cr Conheady said.

"Agriculture is the biggest contributor to our local economy, generating \$805 million of economic output in 2020/21, almost a third of total output. About two and a half thousand of our residents are employed in farming directly or in various supply, service and processing businesses. That makes farming vital for our families and communities to flourish.

"I invite everyone to come along to one of the sessions and share your ideas and experience so we can strengthen and sustain our agricultural future. We encourage residents to read the report and contribute their thoughts at the drop-in sessions, or through Council's website.

Manager Planning and Building Services Aaron Moyne said the Grow Corangamite: Sustaining our Agriculture Future project would provide a comprehensive understanding of the physical, social, and economic attributes that underpin agriculture.

"It will also identify the challenges and opportunities confronting the industry," he said.

"This will enable Council to formulate an economic development and planning framework that will support and grow agriculture into the future. There will be another opportunity to get involved at the completion of the Draft Strategy before it is finalised."

Council seeks community input on timber plantations

An increase in timber plantations has prompted Corangamite Shire Council to weigh up the effect on valuable agricultural land.

At its April meeting, Council released a discussion paper to spark community conversation about current and future land use change.

Mayor Kate Makin said Council wanted to hear residents' views on the issues and opportunities raised in the discussion paper to help plan for a secure future for our agricultural industry.

"In recent years there has been an accelerating change in land use from food production to timber plantations," Cr Makin said.

"These are on highly productive land previously used for food and fibre production.

"Agriculture contributes 100 times more than forestry to the Shire Economy including 45% of the economic output, 38% of the jobs and 70% of the exports.


"Our towns and communities rely heavily on farming with most of the 2,400 plus jobs and \$60 million in wages annually coming from dairy, meat production, sheep and cropping and agricultural services.

"It is important that we plan for what effects land use change may have on the Shire economy and the future of our communities."

Cr Makin said potential concerns included:

- national food security;
- job losses across farming, support and service industries, manufacturing and processing;
- threats to the viability of small communities as agricultural workers and their families leave the region;
- loss of biodiversity, pest and weed incursion;
- increased fire threat;
- Excision of farm dwellings creating isolated rural residences.

The following is an extract from the book "Of sheep and men" published by Claud Notman a well known entity to older residents of Skipton & District. I will publish extracts from chapter 31 in episodes—this is episode one.

Chapter 31

FIRE, FLOOD AND FAMINE

The vagaries of the weather in the Western District have always kept its occupants struggling to overcome the ravages of flood, drought or fire. Beginning with the dry period of settlement in the 1838-41 period, and the destruction of that terrible week that ended up with Black Thursday, in 1851, the following years provided floods of rare intensity. Down on the lower Werribee, in August, 1852, Edward Davey Wedge, his wife and daughter, were washed away, and the surviving son, Thomas, sold out his last 125 acres, and went to live at Brighton, at that time out from Melbourne. These people had been some of the earliest settlers, but they sold their interests in 1849 to Alexander Irvine, who died abroad in 1856. His executors sold then to Thomas Chirnside, already in at Point Cooke, from 1851 on. William Taylor had established a stone hut there about 1849, but later took Overnewton, on the Keilor Road. Starting with small pre-emptive purchases, Thomas Chirnside went on to build up 90,000 acres around the Werribee River, and, with the boom after gold, his purchases previously described would create their own story of family history.

Tom Anderson's diary records the big flood in Mount Emu Creek at Darlington, in 1853, the year of the first Darlington Show, and the Skipton Show and photographs, fortunately preserved by the Elder family descendants, whose people were storekeepers at Skipton for almost 100 years, tell us about the flood in 1870 that troubled the show of that year. The wooden bridge at Skipton was washed away before the stone bridge was built in 1877.

Late in the 1870s, a fire started near the Banongill bridge over Mount Emu Creek and it created havoc across country to the east. Fanned by a strong south-westerly, it sped over Banongill, through Borriyalloak, and out to the Linton ranges. Older generations were known to have described the devastation south of Skipton as complete and there was no grass anywhere left for stock to feed on. Grasshoppers following as a plague did not help matters, either, as the Francis Ormond story illustrates.

There were dry years in the 1890s. The year 1892 saw the banks collapse, and, from 1896 on, to 1902, wool men were struggling with poor prices and lack of rain. Stony Point records indicate that 1902 was the driest year ever, the total rainfall to Christmas being only 10.81 inches, and with over 3 inches in thunderstorms after that period the tally amounted to only 14.17 inches for the year.

In 1894, there was another major flood, following the fire that swept over the plains from the northwest of Mount Bute run, through Glenfine and Naringal and down to the lakes below Cressy. The great snow storm of 1901, following the drought years through the 1890 period, was followed in 1905 by a blizzard that killed thousands of shorn sheep as late as the 3rd of December. Wooriwyrite suffered dreadfully in that storm, losing many thousands of their flock, and within two months the property was burnt out by a fire bearing down from Woorndoo, in January, 1906. After they had suffered these two disasters, half the original flock had been wiped out.
