Council flies flag to stop violence against women

The people of Corangamite Shire are being called to work together to prevent violence against women.

Corangamite Shire Council will fly the flag to support the global 16 Days of Activism against Gender-Based Violence campaign.

Mayor Ruth Gstrein invited community members to a flag raising event outside the Courthouse Camperdown on Monday 27 November at 1 pm.

"Each year the 16 days run from 25 November, the International Day for the Elimination of Violence Against Women, until Human Rights Day on 10 December," Cr Gstrein said.

"It is a time to remind everyone in the community that we can all work together year round to change the story about violence against women.

"Statistics show almost one in four women have experienced intimate partner violence so we all know more than one person who has been affected.

It affects everyone in our community, not only women. Family violence has significant consequences for children and young people.

Even if they don't see or experience abuse, they're still impacted by seeing things like injuries to a parent or damage to property.

"It can impair children's physical, emotional and brain development, their sense of security in relationships, their mental health and have long term consequences for friendships and relationships.

"It is a myth to believe that if babies or children don't see or experience abuse they are not affected. They are always impacted by the harm being caused to their parent whether it is by coercive control, physical, emotional, financial, spiritual or sexual abuse. they're still impacted by seeing things like injuries to a parent or damage to property.

"Family violence is increasing in Victoria's communities and 30% of family violence incidents attended by the police involve children. Corangamite Shire is committed to working with local and statewide services to reduce family violence and it's impacts through community awareness strategies and staff training."

Cr Laurie Hickey said while many people experienced violence, 95 per cent of perpetrators were men.

"Women mostly experience violence at the hands of men, and people who are known to them, while men mostly experience violence from other men, and those they don't know. "Research tells us that sexism and disrespect towards women contribute to a culture that allows, justifies, or even promotes violence towards women.

"Challenging disrespect towards women is everyone's responsibility.

"As blokes we can call out disrespect, sexism and other forms of discrimination early, we can help prevent violence against women. Together we can take steps towards a future where we are all safe, equal and respected."

Respect Victoria's Acting CEO Serina McDuff said an average of one Australian woman every 10 days is killed by a man they know.

"It doesn't have to be this way. Violence against women is preventable, and this 16 Days of Activism and beyond, we have an opportunity to change the story," she said.

"This means we need to address the harmful attitudes and behaviours that drive violence in society. Let's work together to challenge harmful ideas about gender and power and create a future where all women are safe, equal and respected."

Local pools ready to open this weekend

Corangamite Shire's outdoor pools are ready to open their gates for the 2023-2024 season.

Camperdown, Cobden and Terang pools will open Saturday 25 November. Lismore, Skipton and Timboon will follow on Saturday 2 December.

Council Sport and Recreation Coordinator Jane Hinds said the pools were the place to be regardless of the weather.

"All of our pools are solar heated and generally operate between 25 and 28 degrees.

"So if the weather is cooler in the mornings, your local pool is still a great place to go for health and fitness and socialise with friends.

"There is a hotter than average summer predicted so when summer arrives the pool is the ideal spot to escape the heat. It really is the best of both worlds."

Council's Facilities and Recreation and Parks and Gardens Teams have been instrumental in preparing the six outdoor swimming pools in readiness for

the 2023-2024 season.

This includes cleaning and preparing pools, maintaining gardens and general maintenance works including:

- Fibreglass repair and repaint on toddler pool water features at Cobden and Skipton.
- Installation of pulsar units at Timboon, Camperdown and Cobden
- Replacement of a flood light at Timboon and a power pole at Cobden and
- Pressure washing of the concourse and refreshing of tables and chairs at Terang.

Maintenance of filters at Lismore Council Sport and Recreation Coordinator Jane Hinds said the pools were in great shape leading up to the season's opening.

"There is lots in store this season—pool parties, movie nights, inflatables and games, as well as early morning lap swimming and, learn to swim programs.

"On warm nights, open hours may be extended at the discretion of the pool manager," Ms Hinds said.

She said Council had worked closely with YMCA Victoria and swimming pool committees over winter to ensure a strong start to the season.

"The swimming pools continue to provide a range of health and wellbeing outcomes for residents.

"The pools are great fun for kids and also have relaxation and mental health benefits for people of all ages."

Mayor Ruth Gstrein encouraged residents to support their local pool and take advantage

"Love your local pools. They are such valuable community assets and continue to be great value for money.

"They are a terrific opportunity to get the family outdoors and off devices over the summer holidays." she said.

Season tickets are \$185 per family, \$95 per adult and \$85 per child and can be used at all of the Shire's six pools.

Day tickets are \$15.50 per family, \$5.20 per adult and \$4.20 for a child.

Season passes are available from the Civic Centre in Camperdown or can be bought at the pools. EFTPOS facilities are available at each pool.

SOUTH WEST VOLUNTEERS CONDUCT ROADSIDE BURNS AHEAD OF FIRE SEASON

Over 200 CFA personnel and 40 vehicles converged in Cressy and Lismore over the weekend to conduct a 65km roadside planned burn to prepare for the fire season in the South West.

CFA, with the Department of Energy, Environment and Climate Action (DEECA), assist in planned burning across Victoria in high-risk areas that require fuel reduction.



CFA District 6 Assistant Chief Fire Officer Andrew Emery said the planned burn took two full days.

"One of the main reasons this burn was conducted was to create a large and long strategic fire break which can help us control fires that start north of the Hamilton Highway and that are pushed predominantly by northerly winds," Andrew said.



"Grass fires can move extremely fast, even under moderate conditions, so putting in place fire breaks such as the one on the Hamilton Highway gives our firefighters the best chance of stopping fires.

"We identify areas of risk through consultation with local groups and brigades using a combination of fire history, local knowledge, and modelling.

"Once these areas are identified, they are prioritised, and we can then begin putting strategic firebreaks in or other treatment options to reduce fuel loads."

CFA Vegetation Management Support Officer South West

David Muir said as well as having fire protection benefits, burn weekends such as these bring valuable training outcomes.

"Planned activities such as these are an opportunity for us to bring lots of our members together, test our systems and train our new members to help them understand fire behaviour and suppression in a more controlled environment." David said.

"During the burn, our members were able to work on their basic firefighting skills, and our incident controllers and crew leaders were able to refresh and practice their fireground leadership and management skills.

"The burn was separated into two different sectors that operated simultaneously, as this is reflective of what may occur at a real fire.

"We also had our supportive services working through logistics, everything from providing lunch, fuel, fluids, and equipment. It really was a successful day out, thanks to our dedicated CFA volunteers and staff members."



The Fire Danger Period has now commenced across the South West region. Burning off is not permitted without a Permit to Burn, which can be applied for through the Fire Permits Victoria website.

The Veterans Capital Works program gives local organisations funding to upgrade their buildings and facilities for Victoria's veterans. Interested organisations can apply for grants from \$5,000 up to \$50,000 for projects that can be completed within a year.

This program has supported 55 projects since 2021 to complete building and facility upgrades, including the Creswick-Smeaton RSL Sub-Branch which welcomed \$33,830 830 to continue their work on building maintenance and access improvements.

The Restoring Community War Memorials and Avenues of Honour program provides grants of up to \$30,000 for projects that restore community war memorials, honour rolls and avenues of honour and closes on 29 January.

The *Anzac Day Proceeds Fund* supports ex-service organisations to deliver a range of activities that boost the wellbeing of veterans, with 19 organisations supported to continue their work delivering important services to veterans and their families.

Grants have also been awarded to 27 projects through the *Victoria Remembers* grant program, which provides grants of up to \$30,000 for projects that honour veterans' service or educate Victorians on veterans' contributions.

Ararat Legacy has been awarded a grant for the "Legacy in Schools" program, which includes the ANZAC Trip to the Shrine of Remembrance and Legacy Junior Public Speaking Awards, in partnership with rural schools, including Marian College in Ararat, Beaufort Secondary College, and Avoca Primary School.



CR BRETT CUNNINGHAM RE-ELECTED AS GOLDEN PLAINS SHIRE MAYOR

Golden Plains Shire Councillors re-elected Cr Brett Cunningham as Mayor of Golden Plains Shire for 2023-24 following a decisive Council meeting at the Golden Plains Civic Centre in Bannockburn tonight.

Cr Cunningham will serve a second term as Mayor following his appointment as Mayor in 2022. He will serve a one-year term leading up to the next General Council Election on 26 October 2024.

Residents practice fire plans as danger period arrives

Summer is fast-approaching and people across the Shire are getting their properties fire ready and practicing their bushfire CORANGAMITE plans with their families.

The Fire Danger Period (FDP) started on Monday 20 November and Corangamite Shire Manager Environment and Emergency Lyall Bond encouraged residents to clear around their properties before summer arrives.

"With a drier and hotter El Niño summer forecast, CFA have declared the Fire Danger Period earlier than previous years," Mr Bond said.

"The fire season has begun so it's a good time to start preparing now instead of leaving it until the last minute," Lyall Bond said.

"We live in one of the most bushfire prone areas of the country so even if you live in town, significant bush, long grass or coastal scrub is not far away.

"Because the pressure is on in an emergency, we might not think clearly.

"Having a written, and well-practised plan will help you remember what needs to be done during a crisis.

"Everyone's home and needs are different so it's important to have a personalised plan.

"What action will you take when the fire Danger Rating is High, Extreme or Catastrophic? When will you leave? Where will you go? What will you take?

"You might need to plan alternative exit routes in case a road is cut. You need Plans A, B and C for when parents are at work and children are at school, and other variables.

"To help you plan, you can download the CFA's *'Bushfire survival planning template - Leaving early'* from cfa.vic.gov.au/plan-prepare/before-and-during-a-fire/your-bushfire-plan"



Council Fire Prevention Officers have been inspecting properties around the Shire to identify any dangerous fuel levels that need to be cleaned up and issued 277 Fire Prevention Notices (FPNs).

Property owners who received FPNs must comply with the notice by the date identified or face fine of more than \$1923.10, as set by the State Government.

"This date will be set for the end of November, so we encourage the community to contact Council if properties have not been cut and fire fuels reduced after that time," Mr Bond said.

Local pools ready to open this week

Council's Facilities and Recreation and Parks and Gardens Teams have been instrumental in preparing the six outdoor swimming pools in readiness for the 2023-2024 season.

This includes cleaning and preparing pools, maintaining gardens and general maintenance works including:

- Fibreglass repair and repaint on toddler pool water features at Cobden and Skipton.
- Installation of pulsar units at Timboon, Camperdown and Cobden
- Replacement of a flood light at Timboon and a power pole at Cobden and
- Pressure washing of the concourse and refreshing of tables and chairs at Terang.
- · Maintenance of filters at Lismore

Council Sport and Recreation Coordinator Jane Hinds said the pools were in great shape leading up to the season's opening.

"There is lots in store this season—pool parties, movie nights, inflatables and games, as well as early morning lap swimming and, learn to swim programs.

"On warm nights, open hours may be extended at the discretion of the pool manager," Ms Hinds said.

She said Council had worked closely with YMCA Victoria and swimming pool committees over winter to ensure a strong start to the season.

"The swimming pools continue to provide a range of health and wellbeing outcomes for residents.
