

# NEW LINTON MEMORIAL TO HONOUR FALLEN FIREFIGHTERS 25 YEARS ON

Geelong West Fire Brigade unveiled a new memorial at their station today to honour and remember five of its members who lost their lives at the Linton bushfire 25 years ago.

The new plaque is a tribute to Matthew Armstrong, Jason Thomas, Chris Evans, Stuart Davidson and Garry Vredeveldt from Geelong West Fire Brigade, who made the ultimate sacrifice while protecting the community.

Hundreds gathered today for a commemorative service at the Linton Memorial Fountain to mark the 25 year anniversary of the tragedy which is etched in the memories of many CFA members, the families of the fallen firefighters and the broader community.

Geelong West Captain Paul Cockerill said the service, followed by the unveiling of the new memorial at the fire station was a very special and memorable day.

"The new memorial is just one way we can continue to honour our brigade heroes for generations to come," Paul said.

"We don't want their story to be forgotten, I want future members to learn from it and understand the importance of safety and training so hopefully we never have a tragedy like





this again.

"I'm proud of the new memorial and I want to thank the brigade for funding this important addition to our station."

CFA Deputy Chief Officer Rohan Luke attended the commemorative service today and said it was a moving ceremony which touched the hearts of everyone there.

"My thoughts are always with the families of the fallen firefighters and our CFA members, especially those who were at the incident that day, 25 years ago," DCO Luke said.


"We will never forget the sacrifice those firefighters made and we will honour their legacy by continuing to improve our training, equipment and practices.


"There were many learnings about safety and procedures from that tragic day which resulted in the biggest change in CFA history with the introduction of mandatory minimum skills for firefighters.

Presenter and qualified Social Worker and Counsellor, Freya Maberly, explained the links between the body's

Freya also provided simple strategies for attendees to be able to implement into their daily routine to support their



resilience and promote positive mental wellbeing.

Dr. Mark Yates, a renowned Geriatrician and leading expert in Dementia research, captivated the audience with his wealth of knowledge and expertise. His presentation

# Council collects phones for violence survivors

Your unwanted mobile phone could provide a vital lifeline for someone in crisis.

Corangamite Shire Council is seeking donations of unused mobile phones that will be refurbished and distributed through family violence centres and police services.

Mayor Kate Makin said registered charity DV Safe Phone collects, erases and repairs phones then provides them to front line family violence and Police services to support victim survivors of domestic violence.

"DV Safe Phone works with more than 250 domestic violence and law enforcement agencies, safe houses and hospitals across the country," Cr Makin said.

"We are launching this campaign as part of the international 16 Days of Activism against Gender-Based Violence campaign from 25 November, the International Day for the Elimination of Violence Against Women, until Human Rights Day on 10 December.

"Family violence is the leading cause of homelessness for women and children.

"In 2018-19, 90% of adults seeking homelessness services due to family and domestic violence were women.

"These free phones can give those in a volatile situation a safe and private way to reach out for support."

Corangamite Shire is now an Authorised Phone Drop Location where members of the community can drop off unwanted working mobile phones so they can be repurposed and used by someone in need.

Cr Nick Cole said domestic violence affects all walks of life.

"These phones will be distributed to victim survivors of domestic violence, through various frontline organisations and service providers.

"Council believes this is really important work and we are enthusiastic about partnering with DV Safe Phones to provide a location for Phone Drops.

"Council is supporting the cause by locating collection boxes at the Civic Centre with our libraries in Camperdown, Cobden, Derrinallum, Terang and Timboon to come online next month.

"This is an opportunity to make a real difference in the lives of those currently experiencing family and domestic violence.

"We encourage anyone with a spare phone, or two, they no longer use, to drop them in the nearest collection box."

DV Safe Phone founder and CEO Ashton Wood said the phones are provided as part of an individual's 'safety plan' offering a lifeline to call for help when it is needed most.

"A mobile phone is something that many of us take for granted, but it can be a potential lifesaver for victim survivors of domestic and family violence, giving them a direct line to emergency responders and support services," Mr Wood said.

# New glass recycling across Corangamite

Corangamite Shire residents have two new ways to recycle glass jars and bottles with a third on the way. Councillor Jamie Vogels said the Corangamite Regional Landfill at Naroghid and transfer stations at Derrinallum, Simpson, Skipton, Timboon and Port Campbell had all been upgraded to allow for glass recycling.

"This hasn't been a small task by any means," Cr Vogels said.

"The new skips are specifically designed for recycling collection, which makes them taller than the previous bins, so we had to build retaining walls and safety rails so people can use them safely."

Cr Vogels, who represents Corangamite on the Barwon South West Local Government Waste Forum, said Council was aiming for high-value glass collection.

"If people don't help by doing right thing, we'll wind up with a downgraded product.

"Cradle to cradle describes the circulation of materials in a continuous circular economy. In this case "cradle to cradle" means glass bottles and jars getting recycled into new bottles and jars.

"If people put in the wrong materials they will go from "cradle to grave" and be used as road base. It's still recycling but not a circular economy

"As a Council we're aiming high and we just need to

bring the community along with us."

Cr Vogels said the \$320,000 in works were funded by the State Government through the Department of Energy, Environment and Climate Action Transfer Station Upgrade Fund and completed by local contractors.

"They will allow Council to meet new Recycling Victoria legislation to separate glass materials from recycling by 2027."

The new skips are labelled "Glass Only" with another marked "Comingled Recycling".

Council Waste and Sustainability Officer Jessica Maxwell encouraged people to make the most of the new services.

"Not all glass is the same," Miss Maxwell said.

"It's handy to keep in mind that the new skips are only for glass bottles and jars. Other types of glass and crockery must still be disposed of in the landfill bins and is not recyclable"

"We need to keep out other glass products that might contaminate the whole skip, such as windows, mirrors or drinking glasses that can't be recycled back to glass jars.

"If you bring your glass in a box or bag, make sure you empty them into the skip loose.

"Best of all it's cheaper! A bag of glass costs \$1.40 for you to recycle as opposed to \$3 for comingled recycling."

The option for recycling household glass comes on top of a new State Government Container Deposit Scheme. Council is not involved in the container deposit scheme which is run by private enterprise on behalf of the State Government.

Machines are available at Cooinda in Terang, Cobden Golf Club and Timboon Fuel. Find out what can go in the machines and how to collect your refund at <a href="mailto:cdsvic.org.au">cdsvic.org.au</a>

Additionally, new 120L wheelie bins will be delivered to Council's kerbside collection customers across the Shire in February with glass collections to start in March 2024.

The kerbside transition will happen over the coming months so residents can keep putting bottle and jars in their yellow wheelie bin until the glass service starts.

# BE PREPARED. STAY PREPARED.

This Summer will see extreme heat, dry conditions and increased fire danger.

The Bureau of Meteorology (BOM) has declared two major climate drivers; El Nino and a positive Indian Ocean Dipole (IOD) that will impact our weather this season. It's important to not only prepare for yourself and family, but also learn how you can support your community.

Golden Plains Shire entered the Fire Danger Period (FDP) at 1am on Monday 20 November 2023, with fire restrictions in force until the Country Fire Authority (CFA) announces the end of the season.

During the FDP, there are a number of restrictions that residents must adhere to and landowners are required to maintain the levels of fine fuels on their properties.

Landowners in Golden Plains are required to keep grass on their residential properties cut so it is no higher than 100mm during the Fire Danger Period. On properties more than two hectares, grass must be kept below 100mm, up to a minimum of 20 metres from a house or outbuilding.

Council commenced its Fire Hazard Inspection Program on Monday 13 November 2023. If you believe you have been issued with a Fire Prevention Notice but have not received one, please contact Council at enquiries@gplains.vic.gov.au or call 5220 7111.

Residents who have been issued with a Fire Prevention Notice are required to complete necessary works to limit hazards by 4 weeks after the date of issue.

# REGISTER YOUR CAT IN GOLDEN PLAINS SHIRE

Golden Plains Shire is emphasising the importance of animal welfare, calling on residents to register their cats and keep vaccinations up to date. With a nationwide shortage of cat vaccines, local shelters are no longer accepting unvaccinated cats.

Recently, the animal shelters Golden Plains Shire Council has contracts with have advised they are unable to accept cats whose vaccinations are not up to date. As a result, Council officers cannot take cats to an animal shelter and Council has no holding facilities for wandering or abandoned cats. If Council officers cannot locate the cat's owner, the cat cannot be retained after business hours.

To address this issue, Council encourages cat owners to:

- Keep their cat indoors wherever possible.
- Update registration and microchip details
- Ensure their cat is wearing its Council registration tag at all times.
- Consider desexing their cat.

Considering installing an outdoor enclosure for cats accustomed to being outdoors.

Mayor Cr Brett Cunningham said the best way to ensure residents are swiftly reunited with their lost felines is to ensure registration is up to date.

"We are asking cat owners to check their cat's registration details and ensure your phone number and your emergency contact's phone number are current," Cr Cunningham said.

"When your cat is scanned for their microchip, Council's community safety officers can look up the microchip and if your cat is registered, Council officers will have your details readily available so that you can be contacted and reunited you with your cat," he said.

"Council offers a range of incentives for cat owners including reduced registration fees for people with cat enclosures and a subsided cat desexing program for eligible residents. I encourage cat owners to visit Council's website and see what's available."

Due to the cat vaccine shortage, Council has also suspended its cat trapping services, effective immediately. People with a cat trap are asked to cease using the traps and return these to Council as soon as possible. Cat trapping services will resume when contracted animal shelters resume accepting cats again.
