On Friday 26th January 2024, it seemed that all roads in Corangamite Shire pointed towards Skipton as people from as far as Port Campbell on the coast, the townships and farming communities along the way, to the northernmost town in Corangamite Shire, Skipton, to the magnificent Volcanic Lakes and Plains for the annual Australia Day Ceremony to CelebrateII

The Skipton Mechanics Institute Hall was filled to overflowing for the presentation of the Corangamite Shire Community Volunteer Awards.

Mayor Kate Makin in her welcome introduced special guests Hon Dan Tehan MP Federal Member for Wannon, and the Australia Day Ambassador, Margaret Zita OAM. (An apology received from Member for Ripon).

Skipton's Peter Harbinson led the singing of Australia's National Anthem "Advance Australia Fair" beautifully.

Mr. Tehan gave a heartfelt address remembering the time he and his parliamentary colleagues spent here in Skipton in the cleanup following the 2010-2011 Floods, and the numerous local volunteers who helped the Emergency Services personnel during the long recovery period at that time.

"It was a fantastic effort by a great group of 100 volunteers. There were 31 on stage and an orchestra of 12.


"There were about 140 hours of rehearsals. That's not including the time spent preparing for them, making costumes and construction work. It took many hundreds of hours.

PYRENEES SHIRE COUNCIL Community satisfaction survey 2024

Pyrenees Shire residents are invited to share their views on Council's performance with the annual Community Satisfaction Survey.



Market research agency National Field Services will conduct the telephone survey.

"Providing answers to the questions from National Field Services will help Council to improve service delivery to residents," Pyrenees Shire Council Mayor Cr Robert Vance said.

Cr Vance urged residents to take part, saying that participation in the survey is a great way to give back to the community.

"We understand that people are busy and don't always want to answer questions from survey companies, but if people can make the time to respond then this information really helps us do a better job," Cr Vance said.

The survey questions have been designed to assess the performance of Council across a range of measures to identify ways to provide improvement or more effective service delivery to residents.

National Field Services will be calling up a representative number of residents during February and March to speak to them. These calls may happen out of business hours and over weekends.

Residents' details and individual responses are confidential. Only the overall results are shared with Pyrenees Shire Council.

The results of the survey will be published by Council in the middle of the year.

<u>Final report on Lake</u> <u>Bullen Merri algae trial</u>



An 18-month trial has not solved blue green algae issues in Lake Bullen Merri.

Corangamite Shire Council recently received the final report on the Lake Bullen Merri Blue Green Algae Control Pilot.

The project tested ultrasonic equipment intended to break up algae cells.

Manager Environment and Emergency Lyall Bond said an independent scientific advisor had analysed the Pilot which was finished early last year.

"They found the process was not effective on the three key measures," Mr. Bond said.

"There was no strong evidence of a change in algae densities from the previous or following year.

"There was also minimal disruption to the dominant cyanobacteria species.

"Sampling showed no significant changes in cell walls and cell counts across the study. "The report concluded technology and pontoon reliability would need to be optimised if future pilots or trials were to be considered."

The ultrasonics did not remove the nutrients from the lake, which is one of the main contributing factors to blue green algae blooms and further work would be beneficial to understand nutrient cycles at the lake.

The final report can be found at www.corangamite.vic.gov.au/BGA
The Mayor Kate Makin said it was disappointing that the pilot did not provide a solution to the lake's algae issues.

"Now that Council has undertaken this pilot, we are hopeful that the lake managers will consider trailing or implementing other control programs.

"Lake Bullen Merri is a really special place for a lot of fishers and recreational boat users from across the shire and beyond.

"We want to see it in a healthy condition for use by our residents and visitors."





Beaufort's George Kirsanovs has been recognized for his commitment to his community by being named the 2024 Pyrenees Citizen of the Year.

Pyrenees Shire Council Mayor Cr Robert Vance announced the award at the Australia Day even at the Avoca Recreation Reserve on Friday.

Cr Vance acknowledged Mr. Kirsanovs' generosity of spirit and his dedication in volunteering many hours of his time for the community.

"George was the principal of Beaufort Secondary College from 1984 to 2004 and he shaped many young minds during his time there," Cr Vance said.

"He is also a very respected member of Beaufort Rotary, and is the main organizer and coordinator setting up the 'Driver Reviver' program for travellers on our roads during busy holiday periods."

Cr Vance also recognised Mr. Kirsanovs' contribution to the community beyond education and Rotary, especially through volunteering and involvement in many other organisations over the years.

"George has been a committee member of Beaufort Walkfest, B4B, Save the Beaufort Old Primary School Committee, and Beaufort Agricultural Show Committee. He is truly dedicated to bringing the best out of our Shire," Cr Vance said.

The Pyrenees Young Citizen of the Year, Community Event of the Year, and Leadership Award were also presented.

Beaufort's Harrison Grant and Naomi Gerrard shared the Young Citizen of the Year title, with both young people showing outstanding leadership qualities.

"Harrison has spent many hours volunteering with many of Beaufort Apex Club's community service activities such as Apex Global International Tree Planting Day, cutting firewood for vulnerable persons in the community, Beaufort Apex Home Help program and working in the Apex kitchen at the Lake Goldsmith Steam Rally," Cr Vance said.

Cr Vance noted that Mr. Grant had been involved in the 2023 Western Bulldogs Leadership project and showed great promise as a young leader.

"Last year Harrison completed the Western Bulldogs Leadership Project and his project was one of two chosen



by WorkSafe to be further developed. His foresight for community need is a wonderful asset for our community," Cr Vance said.

Ms Gerrard has grown up in Beaufort, spending her time volunteering for the community.

"Naomi has shown a dedication and commitment to her community, excelling in leadership. She has received significant awards such as the Carl Gustus Citizenship award twice, the Long Tan Leadership Award, and the Queens Guide Award," Cr Vance said.

"It's wonderful to see our young people stepping up and volunteering for our community, making it a better place for everyone to live in," Cr Vance said.

The Community Event of the Year was awarded to the Beaufort Agricultural Society's 19th annual Beaufort Show held in November 2023.

"Given what we've been through over the last few years, our community really values the chance to catch up with friends and neighbours whom they may not have seen in a while and have a chat. Having social connection with people is important and the Show is a great event for the community to come together each year," Cr Vance said.

The Pyrenees Leadership Award acknowledges a lifelong or extra special commitment that invigorates the community and inspires others along the way.


This year's recipient was the Beaufort Service Group, who was recognised for helping many organisations in Beaufort and surrounds to continue their work in the community.

Authorities issue burns warning ahead of long weekend

Following a concerning spike in preventable burns injuries since December, burns specialists at The Alfred have joined forces with CFA to issue an urgent call for action: take care around fire this Australia Day long weekend.

The Victorian Adult Burns Service (VABS) at The Alfred, which treats the most severe burns injuries from across the state, saw a 42 per cent increase in admissions in December 2023, compared to December 2022. The patients – particularly young men – suffered serious burns caused by fire pits, campfires and barbecues. Alex Tobin, 21, was camping near Lake Eildon just after Christmas last year when he fell into a campfire and sustained significant burns to 18 per cent of his body, the majority to his legs.

"I had a lot to drink and I put petrol on the campfire to start it up.



I bumped into my mate behind me, and the jerry can poured petrol over my legs and they caught on fire," he said.

"My mate grabbed me and dragged me to the lake until emergency services turned up.

"My message to others is just think twice, you don't need to put petrol on a fire, what happened to me, could happen to anyone.

Alex is off work for the next two months.

"This Australia Day long weekend, we

know many people will be heading away camping, gathering with friends for a barbecue, or enjoying a campfire on a warm night," said Alfred burns surgeon Dane Holden.

"We ask that those people behave safely around fire – the types of injuries we have seen recently cause scars that can last a lifetime, and require weeks and months of hospital care. Many of those injuries were entirely preventable. If you're thinking about using accelerant on a fire – just don't do it."

In the last year, CFA responded to 186 incidents involving a campfire.

CFA second lieutenant at Diamond Creek Fiona Macken said Victorians needed to take care when using recreational fires ahead of the long weekend.

"We know how dangerous fire can be so it's important to be careful this long weekend if you're gathered around a barbecue or campfire. "Campfires can remain hot well after the flames have burnt down, so avoid walking on them and always extinguish them completely with water before leaving and never put an accelerant on them.

"Always do a safety check before igniting a barbecue and if you're burnt it is critical to apply cool running water immediately. You can find out more at cfa.vic.gov.au.

"I urge all Victorians to take care this weekend and stay safe."

The survey questions have been designed to assess the performance of Council across a range of measures to identify ways to provide improvement or more effective service delivery to residents.


National Field Services will be calling up a representative number of residents during February and March to speak to them. These calls may happen out of business hours and over weekends.

Council calls landowners to join war on ragwort

Well into its \$250,000 annual weed control program, CORANGAMITE Corangamite Shire Council is calling on landowners to help control ragwort.

A contractor has been treating Ragwort in December and January on 346 km of Council-managed roadsides and Council land in the South of the Shire and is due to undertake the second round of control in the coming weeks.

Council's work complements weed control undertaken by landowners to control weeds across the region.

Mayor Kate Makin said the weed is poisonous to grazing animals, both when fresh and dried in fodder.

"It causes liver damage and can kill cattle, horses, pigs and chickens," Cr Makin said.

"Dairy cattle forced to graze ragwort produce tainted milk which makes it a major threat to the most important industry in our Shire.

"Council is encouraging landowners to take care of any outbreaks on their properties that might spill over onto neighbouring land or roadways.

"As they say, one year of seeding means seven years of weeding.

"Weeds outcompete native vegetation and cause problems for our agricultural industries. Everyone playing their part will make a huge difference."

In Corangamite Shire, ragwort is most prolific south of Cobden and around Timboon.

It is most notable during spring and summer when it has bright yellow daisy-like flowers. Seeds are spread by wind, water, animals, farm implements, produce including hay, on clothing and other equipment.

Ragwort's dense foliage close to the ground prevents regeneration of other vegetation.

It outcompetes more desirable plants, reducing pasture productivity and the value of agricultural land. It also displaces native vegetation on our roadsides and reserves.

Recommended measures include applying a registered herbicide, cultivation and physical removal. Seeds can remain in the ground for well over seven years, so annual follow-up control is required.

Landowners with ragwort on their property are encouraged to seek advice from their local chemical/farm supplier on methods and herbicides fit for their purpose and region.

Landowners and land managers are responsible under the Catchment & Land Protection (CALP) Act 1994 to control ragwort and other state prohibited weeds on their land. Agricultural Victoria is responsible in ensuring they comply.



GEOCACHING FILM A WIN FOR SKIPTON

Just over a year ago, a group of geocachers came to Skipton to celebrate New Years Eve, to explore the town via the local caches, and to make a film about geocaching in an aged care setting.

Written, directed and produced by local Registered Nurse Jo Brock (geocaching name "chooknchunk"), the film was strongly supported by the Beaufort & Skipton Health Service, giving her access to the Skipton Day Centre and front garden area for the filming.

The short three and a half minute film is a take on what geocachers might imagine their ideal aged care facility would be like. While sprinkled with many

geocaching gags, it is based on the Montessori Model of Dementia and Aged Care (https://montessorifordementia.com.au/), where the aged geocachers continue daily engagement in their passion of geocaching with the support of their nurses.

The film, titled "Geocare - Home for the Aged Geocacher", was made to be part of a local geocache and was also



submitted for the 2023 Geocaching International Film Festival (GIFF).

Given the lack of previous film making experience, there were no expectations that the film would make it to the final reel, so the squeals of delight were deafening when advised that it was one of 18 finalists from nearly 60 worldwide submissions.

The GIFF film reel was shown in over 540 venues around the world during November 2023, but the ride didn't end there. Viewers from around the world voted on their favourite film and in December it was announced that Geocare was the winner of the People's Choice Award, with an unprecedented 59% of the vote.

The film, and its associated geocache, has already encouraged more geocachers to visit Skipton, including some from interstate.

MORE MACQUARIE PERCH STOCKED TO SUPERSIZE RECOVERY

The future of the endangered Macquarie perch continues to shine brighter with nearly 80,000 fingerlings stocked into Victorian waters to re-establish wild populations across the state, backed by the Allan Labor Government.

Minister for Outdoor Recreation Steve Dimopoulos today announced more than 78,000 Macquarie perch produced at the Victorian Fisheries Authority's (VFA) Snobs Creek hatchery near Eildon have been stocked into nine rivers and lakes to fast track the recovery of the once-prominent native fish.

Steve Dimopoulos said "Macquarie perch were once abundant throughout much of northern Victoria and these stockings are a vital step in rebuilding wild populations so future generations can enjoy these magnificent native fish."

"The work being done to crack the code when it comes to breeding Maccas will lead to reliable production and achieving the long-term goal of sustainable recreational fisheries for Macquarie perch in years to come."

The production and release of the 'Macca' fingerlings has been supported by the Labor Government's \$96 million Go Fishing and Boating Victoria plan and recreational fishing license fees — boosted by the VFA's record-breaking fish stocking program which as its sights set on stocking 10 million fish for the second time in three years.

More than 20,000 Macquarie perch fingerlings have been stocked in the King River while the Goulburn River has been boosted with 13,100 fish.

Cudgewa Creek received 12,800 fingerlings, the Ovens and Buffalo rivers have each been stocked with 10,000 fish and Broken River welcomed 5,000 fish.



Dartmouth Dam was topped up with 3,000, while Seven Creeks gained 2,800 and 2,000 went into Hughes Creek.

This year of production is the first to benefit from a three-year, multi-million-dollar research project led by the Albanese and Allan Labor Governments to 'crack the code' on breeding Macquarie perch.

With collaboration across community and educational organisations, catchment management authorities, research partners and recreational fishers, the project ensures we learn more about the best nutrition, hormones and breeding conditions for Macquarie perch to thrive in the hatchery environment.

Member for Northern Victoria Jaclyn Symes said "Rivers across the north-east are already showing positive signs from recent years of stocking, the future looks bright for the Macquarie perch".

The recovery of Macquarie perch is also supported by significant upgrades at the VFA's Snobs Creek and Arcadia fish hatcheries, with \$15 million invested in world-class infrastructure. Snobs Creek now features a new captive breeding centre with leading aquaculture technology.

The VFA is also protecting wild populations of Macquarie perch with new rules for recreational fishers across Victoria.


