

The Presidents report for 2023-24 contained the following:

A sincere thank you to Kathy & Michael Sproules, Kathy for all the hard work as editor of our SCN, for over 30 years and Michael for his many years as Treasurer of the Association and to both of them for their many years of community service in many clubs/groups/organisations in Skipton and district.

The Paper is our major fundraiser, and yes it does contained a few ads. These advertisers all serve our community and need your support whenever you can. Without the ads, or far fewer of them, we would have to apply for grants and that would mean taking funds away from other local groups who have no other way of raising funds for their projects.

Our market continues, but like most country markets, with fewer numbers, and less cash around it is the stall holders wishes and the snack and a tea/coffee available by the hard working volunteers in the ajoining supper room that keeps this going.

Other achievements that your SPA did for the year was helping the Skipton Pool Trust to obtain grants for new equipment, offers to help with the highly successful celebration of World Womens Day, We also wrote letters of support for our council to retain the ward election system to ensure we were represented in council by people who new the needs of this district, We were very pleased to recently hear the electoral commission had decided to retain the ward system which I feel is a major win for common sense and fair representation.

Our Skipton Pride group headed by Malcom held a number of Art & Craft events through the year and all were very well attended, some being sold out almost immediately these were held in our well equipped Mechanics Hall another event held by Malcolm's group was a meal (50% subsidized by SPA) where the Chinese chef spoke of his journey to where he is now and also gave a demonstration on some very ancient Chinese musical instruments, this of course was also held in the halls supper room which also has an excellent well equipped industrial kitchen.

We usually also provided financial and physical help to the Skipton Historical Society with their annual Australia Day celebration. This year the Shire organised the whole event except for the traditional flag raising which was performed by the SHS. That was a highly successful event and the Shire need to be congratulated for the event. The public meeting we called for public input into the Skipton Plan had 26 people attend despite freezing cold, torrential rain and a howling wind. This meeting came about due to feed back and complaints from local residents that a small group of people were consulting with council and the residents who live here were not being given a say in the future of the town.

We also continued to pay private contractors to mow the grass on this end of the rail trail after we managed to get council to fence off these areas to allow this and some sheep grazing while ensuring the trees planted and cared for over many years were not destroyed.

Our spring festival was a great success, coupled with help from the SHS and many locals. This was a project of our events committee headed by Natasha Frisby, with Helen Purvis donating many hours of her time helping organize and advertise the event. The events committee organise our events and comprise of some committee members and non members which makes for some great new ideas. The completion of the Blade Shearer monument after it was first started before the pandemic and at a cost of many \$000/s was a major achievement by both past and present SPA members. But well worth all the work This years annual Spring Festival will be held on Saturday 9th November 2024. Please spread the work and keep the date free.

For Christmas we helped the op-shop put on their annual town Christmas party, as well as helped them with their own town Christmas decorations along with our own town Christmas lights which are an on going project. Last but certainlt not least, while Lilla has now moved into 2nd Vice President position we have to thank Lilla for all her many years as Secretary of the SPA along with all the many other hats Lilla ears Thank you


URGENT CARE CENTRE – A CRITICAL SERVICE

The bushfire emergency in the Beaufort region recently highlighted the crucial role that skilled and local emergency services had in supporting communities during the fires. In addition, the importance of having efficient and a highly competent healthcare team was also made evident while many community members were impacted by the event. During the Beaufort campus evacuation, the Urgent Care Centre continued to play a vital role to community members.


CEO, Meryn Pease, expressed her thanks to her Health Service staff at a recent afternoon tea

organised as a show of appreciation for the outstanding effort. "I am immensely proud of the Beaufort and Skipton Health Service team and the outstanding job they did in evacuating nearly 30 vulnerable patients and residents, and I must say, this was done while providing care to community members through our Urgent Care Centre," Ms Pease said.

The recent event highlighted the vital role the Urgent Care Centre played in delivering essential healthcare assistance as several team members managed to provide care to patients with various medical needs, including those suffering from smoke inhalation and Beaufort & Skipton breathing difficulties.

"These difficult times have shown just how important our Urgent Care Centre is and that it is available 24/7, and particularly when our community is facing a crisis." Ms Pease expressed. "It is essential that our community is reassured during these times, knowing that our Health Service nurses are trained to handle everything from minor injuries to serious medical emergencies, and they can even consult with GP's or the Victorian Virtual Emergency Department for additional expertise," Ms Pease explained. "Our team also includes a number of Rural and Isolated Practice Registered Nurses who provide specialised skills, offering services such as administration of certain medications without the need for GP prescriptions, immunisations, treatment of wounds and minor illnesses," she went on to say.

The Beaufort and Skipton Health Urgent Care Centres and their respective services are available 24 hours a day, seven days a week, providing a range of care and services to support the community.

Our Learning

Prep - 2

We will be learning how to do 'choral reading' to improve our fluency this week and reading familiar books to practice this skill. In writing we will be working on recording the sounds we can hear to spell unknown words. We will be writing a variety of texts to continue our focus on the correct use of capital letters and full stops. Place value continues to be our focus in maths as we look specifically at ordering numbers.

Grade 3/4

In the 3 / 4 class we have been developing team working and resilience skills across the week over and above the learning in our traditional areas. Next week we will be being exploring Australian as Mrs Stevens will be gaining Australian citizenship on Tuesday. In maths the preparation for Naplan continues alongside developing an understanding of inverse operations and the links between addition and subtraction. Literacy see the culmination of our narrative learning and creating some exciting and engaging text.

Grade 5/6

Week 7 in Grade 5-6 will see the Grade 5s complete the first of their 4 NAPLAN assessments. We'll continue our comprehension focus, with students working on monitoring while reading and identifying figurative language within their Literature Circle texts. Maths will continue to focus on multiplication, with students eager to revise old strategies and learn new, efficient ones. Parent Helpers!

CSEF and Conveyance Allowance

There are two forms of student financial assistance available for some families. If you are attending your closest primary school and drive more than 5km to your bus stop, you may be eligible for the Conveyance Allowance to assist with travel expenses. CSEF is also available to families who have a current healthcare card and receive some sort of government assistance. CSEF is \$150.00 per year and can be used to help pay for camps, sports or excursions. If you think you qualify for either of these options please see Natalie for an application form.
