

Book Review

Red Notice and Freezing Order By Bill Browder. 2015 -2022

In this era of war on so many fronts, it has been illuminating to finally finish a duo of books that

cover events from the early part of this century to about 2015 in Europe and America.

Bill Browder was a young financier searching for a market for his investment skills, which he finally found in Eastern Europe and then Russia. He was able to set up and run a very success hedge fund investment business in Moscow, living and working in the Russian city with his young family.

But Russia is a hard place to deal with, and he found that he was confronted with a "swamp" of rorts and money laundering schemes, and had incurred the wrath of the Russian President Putin, whose cohort oligarchs where benefiting more from their investments than Putin himself – not a good idea. Browder was systematically and illegally put out of business and ended up fleeing Russia (with an InterPol Red Notice hanging over his head), leaving behind some of his staff and his loyal Russian lawyer Sergei Magnitsky.

There are brilliant descriptions of illegal imprisonment, murder, torture, men having to flee for their lives, all at Putin's direction via the appauling Secret Police, trying to recover some investments for his customers, and especially the fight to save Sergei Magnitsky, which failed. Like more recent targets, he died in prison of "natural causes". What could be done was to get through the American government system, House Committees, Senate, Congress, a law punishing those involved in such criminal behaviour by financial sanctions.

It may seem not a lot to fill two books, but the books are so informative about Russia, it's history, it's attitudes, it blinkered pursuits of what it sees as the necessary path, and it's blind disregard of justice and the rule of law (it's own law and international law), all of which

we are seeing at present in the Ukraine conflict. And both books are so well written, so descriptive, filled with interesting personalities, and with so much political background to the world in general and the East-West confrontation in particular. So much is clarified and

explained, that it is well worth tackling this duo, even if you do have to skip a bit, if like me, the financial side gets way beyond your pay gradel

Two great reads for those who are trying to understand where we all find ourselves in 2024.

Have your say on digital connectivity in the Pyrenees

Whether it's your mobile phone reception or your range of choice in internet service providers, Council wants to hear your views on and experiences with telecommunications and connectivity across the Pyrenees Shire.

Pyrenees Mayor Cr Robert Vance said Council is currently developing a Digital Connectivity Plan and it was essential to gather a wide range of views and experiences from all corners of the Shire to inform the research.

Cr Vance said Council knows that a lot of Pyrenees Shire experienced patchy, slow or non-existent mobile reception and internet coverage.

"The Digital Connectivity Plan will provide the research and data to help Council advocate to governments and tech organisations for high-quality digital connectivity right across the region," he said.

"Whether you use mobile and internet services for work, study, business or personal reasons, we all know how important they are for daily life. Digital connectivity is an essential service, and our region needs significant investment and technological upgrades for our residents and ratepayers to prosper."

Moreton Hill Wind Farm

The proposed Moreton Hill Wind Farm is located on Wadawurrung Country, about 35 kilometres southwest of Ballarat. The wind farm will have up to 62 turbines. producing enough electricity to power around 260,000 homes and prevent almost 350,000 tonnes of emissions annually.

The wind farm is proposed to connect to the electricity network via a new underground 220kV powerline to the Berrybank terminal station about nine kilometres south of the wind farm.



DO YOU TIRE OF EGGS?

THEN CURRY THEM THIS WAY

Eggs rank among the most nutritious of i ors, but some people tire of them quickly; possibly because of the time honored methods of serving them—the good old poached, bailed or fried! Variation, however, can readily be introduced by the resourceful cook, who will probably like to try the novel method of currying eggs described in this month's "Australian Journal"

The ingredients are:—4 eggs, 2 small onions, 13 ozs butter or good beef dripping, ½ pint stock, 1 oz curry powder, 1 oz flour, 1 teaspoon chutney (finely chopped), rind 1 lemon (grated), juice ½ lemon, salt to taste, few grains cayenne, ¼ lb rice.

Hard-boil the eggs. When they are cold, cut them carefully into quarters. Meanwhile, peel and chop the onions finely and fry them in the butter. Keep stirring, for onions burn quickly. As soon as they are brown add the curry powder. Blend the flour with the stock and add, stirring continuously until it boils. Simmer gently for five minutes; add the lemon juice and rind, also the chutney. Add the eggs and continue to simmer for ten minutes.

Cook the rice in boiling salted water for thirteen minutes. Rinse under running water, thus separating the little grains of rice and preventing it from becoming "mushy," Arrange in a border round the serving dish and pour the curry into the centre. Sprinkle a little chopped parsley here and there on the rice.







AH: 5340 2017 15 SCOTT ST, SKIPTON The following is an extract from the book "Of sheep and men" published by Claud Notman a well known entity to older residents of Skipton & District. I will publish extracts from chapter 31 in episodes—this is episode six:

One day, in 1946, we were playing cricket in the Western Plains, and remarked on the inky black sky down in the south-west. A stationary 'low' settled in about Warrnambool, and poured 8 inches (200 mm) of rain over the area. Further east, the rain eased, but tractors were bogged early in April.

There were other years to remember on the Plains, the very wet ones in 1951, 1952, 1956, 1960, 1964 and 1965, the last being the highest for rainfall since records were taken at Mawallok, almost 38 inches, (or 950 mm). As if all the rain had emptied the skies, we saw the next year weaken off for a poor season, and, by May, 1967, phalaris poisoning was evident as the sheep, when hungry, and put on to a sprinkling of green shoot, started staggering and died. By November of 1967 one of the worst droughts was on, and, on Anzac Day, 1968, sheep actually died when smothered by flying sand in the wind funnels along the granite country. A week later, it was all over, with four inches in a week, but damage to the nation's flocks was so severe that the maximum figures of the 1960s have not been reached since.

Then, on February 12, 1977, it happened all over again. Shall we ever forget the 25 feet high wall of flame bearing down on hapless Streatham, with less than five minutes to go, and the women of the town wondering what to do. Some fled east to Skipton, others stayed around their hall, and, fortunately, all were saved. A rising gale-force wind made that a day of horror for so much of our beloved country, as fire upon fire broke away from power lines in the T.F.B. (Total Fire Ban) conditions.

Once more, the western country was swept, as fire bore down on Nareeb Nareeb, and neighbouring properties, for the third time in less than 40 years. Again the Beggs family lost heavily with over 2,000 sheep destroyed. Brie Brie, also stricken three times, over the same period, lost very heavily. On Scrubby Hill, when the wind changed, a spot fire was known to break out some 24 miles away. We were reminded of an incident such as this, known to have happened near Cudgewa, in 1939, when a fire hurricane raced up a steep rock mountain and threw a spot fire 9 miles away into the Nariel valley.
