

Moreton Hill Wind Farm

The proposed Moreton Hill Wind Farm is located on Wadawurrung Country, about 35 kilometres southwest of Ballarat. The wind farm will have up to 62 turbines, producing enough electricity to power around 260,000 homes and prevent almost 350,000 tonnes of emissions annually.

The wind farm is proposed to connect to the electricity network via a new underground 220kV powerline to the Berrybank terminal station about nine kilometres south of the wind farm.

New planning program aims to help navigate the process of rebuilding after fire

If your home, business, shed or other structure was destroyed in the Bayindeen fires and you want to rebuild, Pyrenees Shire Council's new Bushfire Recovery Planning Program (BRPP) will help you navigate the process.

Pyrenees CEO Jim Nolan said the planning permit application process for a bushfire-affected property is different from a standard application, with the BRPP aiming to help impacted residents navigate the process with the support of an independent planning consultant.

Mr Nolan said Council hoped the BRPP service, which is funded by Council's Statutory Planning service, would make the rebuilding process less daunting for residents.

"The BRPP will provide specialised advice and support to help streamline the process for residents to rebuild," Mr Nolan said.

"As part of Council's commitment to recovery from the fires, there will be no cost for this service and no fees for the associated planning permits."

The BRPP provides clear steps through the rebuilding process from registration and initial contact with Council through to a review of the resident's rebuilding needs and ongoing help and guidance.



Camperdown saleyards to close

National livestock sales company Regional Livestock Exchange has decided to cease operating at the Camperdown saleyards.

RLX has notified Corangamite Shire Council it will terminate its lease on the Councilowned property.

It is expected the last sale day will be on Tuesday 25 June.

Corangamite Shire Council Chief Executive Officer David Rae said the decision by RLX, while disappointing, was not unexpected.

"RLX's decision to cease operation is a business matter outside Council's control.

"The company has spoken with agents and users of the facility advising of intent to close. Council also plans to speak with agents," Mr Rae said.

"RLX will be responsible for decommissioned the site and making it safe before handing it over to Council."

Mr Rae said RLX had operated the site since 2018.

"In that time the market has changed and more cattle are being taken to other venues instead of Camperdown.

He said the closure will not result in any significant lost revenue for Council.

Mr Rae declined to speculate on future of the site before all avenues were thoroughly explored.

"Council will investigate the future use of the site but—given the business realities prompting RLX's decision—is unlikely to take over management of the saleyard.

"Possibilities include looking for another operator, or identifying alternative uses for the land.

"It will be a lengthy process to determine what other uses may be possible and what will be required to decommission the saleyards and potentially repurpose the land.

"Any decision will have to consider prudent investment of ratepayers' money into the future, and maximising community benefit."

BELOW ARE SOME EXTRACTS FROM THE 1934 SKIPTON & STREATHAM GAZETTE FROM 90 YEARS AGO

LET THERE BE LIGHT

OFFENDERS FINED FOR FAILURE

Road traffic regulations require that motor cars and other vehic es traversing the roads between the hours of sunset and sunrise shall carry certain lighted lamps in such a position as to clearly show their location to persons who may be approaching or passing them. Failure to comp y with those regulations caused the appearance of several pe sons at Skipton Police Court last Wednesday, to answer charges of not having the necessary lights showing when travelling on roads in the vicinity of the town. The charges were laid by First Constable Newton, and Messrs M. Notman (chairman) and A. M. Elder, J.sP., were on the Bench.

Fines were recorded as follows:—
Thomas Millikin, driver of a motor bus between Ballarat and Hamilton, £1, for not having two white head lights and one red tail light showing between the hours of sunset and sunrise. For failing to show the nec-ssary lights on horse drawn vehicles, Les. Cluff, John Merton and Irevor Andrews were each fined 5/.

Two cases were dealt with in the Children's Court. Walter Wilkie was fined 2/6 for riding a bicycle without exhibiting head and tail lights, as required. Murray Wilkie was fined 2/6 for using a horse-d awn vehicle after sunset without having lights showing.

RADIO RUMBLINGS

Directions for making an excellent "B' battery are contained in this month's "Australian Journal."
Thirty six test tubes are required for the jars or containers; 31 feet of No. 20 S.W.G. bare copper wire; 30 pieces of valve rubber, four inches long; 30 pieces of zinc. 4½ inches long by half an inch wide; a solution of Epsom salts for the exciting fluid, and a small quantity of sulphate of copper (bluestone) crystals

Take a piece of copper wire one foot long and twist about half of it into a coil. Insulate the straight part of the wire with a piece of valve rubber, and stand the copper in a test tube,

To the zinc a piece of wire is soldered, and the zinc is arranged to hang on top of the tube. Fill the tube half full of a solution of Epsom salts, and then put in enough bluestone crystals to cover the coil of copper wire.

Each of the test tubes should be treated in a similar fashion. When complete, the cell should be arranged in a wooden stand, and should be connected together in series; that is, the zinc of one to the copper of the next, and so on.

The coil of copper wire should be made into the form of a slightly tapering spiral, and it should be just covered with bluestone crystals.

The electro-motive force of each cell is about one volt, but the amperage is low. However, it is not amperage that is needed, and, as the current will remain constant for some time, this battery will prove an ideal one for wireless work. When the receiver is not in use, the battery should be short-circuited through a high resistance.





AH: 5340 2017 15 SCOTT ST, SKIPTON The following is an extract from the book "Of sheep and men" published by Claud Notman a well known entity to older residents of Skipton & District. I will publish extracts from chapter 31 in episodes—this is episode seven and the final episode completing chapter 31.

Another fire broke away from power lines at the north-west of Pura Pura country, and tore away out of control towards Terrinallum and adjacent properties, and finally finished up over the top of Mount Elephant once again, petering out in the marshes on Larra, the old Currie property, so prominent in our earlier chapters. Some outbuildings were destroyed there, but homestead and stables, so much valued by the National Trust, were saved. Again, several homes were destroyed, and stock losses varied, but no lives were lost in this fire. It was a state of affairs that, as men from Streatham district raced to battle this fire, and others to the west were drawn to the Glenthompson blaze, few fire-fighters could protect Streatham. We have vivid memories of those last few minutes, as the fire moved in, across Blythvale, from the north. As it reached the town it broke into five tongues, each a severe finger of fire. The second tongue never hesitated across the cemetery area, where the trees must have thrown spot fires over a ploughed threechain road. We watched it cross the Glenelg Highway then, where it never faltered, and were forced to retreat to the east as more fingers came down from the north. When the wind changed to the west, the hall and houses at Carranballac were at first saved, and then later burnt, before the damp of night and a massive array of trucks choked it on the Glenelg highway. The Streatham church, originally Presbyterian, but now a Uniting Church, was burnt out, and has since been wonderfully restored. The ancient Hotel we had to watch burn down, and, when we inspected the fine, relatively new Hall, fire was coming through the ceiling. With joy, we were able to call in one of the few fire units, battling at the stage end to put out burning rubbish under the building, and it still stands. As one farmer rushed home from the Nerrin fire to check on his home and family, he was overtaken by the flames and died from his burns. It was fortunate that there were not more people caught in and around Streatham in that holocaust.

There were numerous other fires that day. Lismore was in grave danger, when an outbreak started on Gala, swept through Eildon and was beaten as it slowed downhill along the creek, just north of the town. Lismore firefighters were justifiably proud!

Cressy, to the east, was in a sorry plight. Stricken in 1944, it again saw fire raging down from just south of Naringal, in the Wallinduc district, and much destruction was caused in the town itself, and some of those people who had lost homes in 1944, saw their rebuilt houses go again. The west wind carried tongues of fire almost to the same stone wall where the 1944 fire was stopped. History had repeated itself on the Plains that day!

As with California, where, as these words go into print, 60 to 70 homes have been destroyed in their brush fires, we never know what next to expect when the crescent moon comes up, and sets in the west, in January, February, or March, even this year, 1981, in April — until the rains come!
