



Stewart Park Committee of Management, Winter 2024

The members of the Stewart Park Committee of Management, with their supporters and friends and those connected with the development of the Park, especially this Winter would like to pay tribute to the late Arthur Welfare, who played a crucial part in the development of the Park, choosing and sourcing trees and shrubs especially, and who did so much of the hard work with spade and shovel and watering can too!

Arthur came to Australia as a child from Britain, and found a place in 1944 on the Bradvale property of the Smith family as a farmer. That was not a particularly good year to make a start on the land, as the fires of 1944 tore through the Smith property along with so many others. Arthur persevered, helped to restore the property, becoming a part of the community, marrying and starting a family, and all the time learning, through books and observation about our native plants and trees, to the extent that he established a successful native plant nursery on his property.

Stewart Park was redeveloped from 1997 onwards, with Arthur on the original planning committee. Work included removing exotic plants and trees, endless weed control, and choosing, sourcing and planting both "arboretum" and native trees and shrubs. Twenty five years later we see those trees maturing, and flowering, on in some cases reaching the end of their natural lives, but we hope Arthur approved of the work of the current committee with the emphasis on indigenous plantings. We do know that he would have watched with joy the part our young helpers from the Primary School have played in new developments.

So thank you Arthur, you were always ready with advice from your huge knowledge of our native plants, our whole Skipton community has benefitted from what you created in our parks and gardens, you were the best gardener, mentor, neighbour, friend, plantsman and farmer, and teacher and especially as the wattle bursts into flower, what you have created continues to surround us. Arthur Leslie Welfare, 1927-2024.



Moreton Hill Wind Farm

The proposed Moreton Hill Wind Farm is located on Wadawurrung Country, about 35 kilometres southwest of Ballarat. The wind farm will have up to 62 turbines, producing enough electricity to power around 260,000 homes and prevent almost 350,000 tonnes of emissions annually.

The wind farm is proposed to connect to the electricity network via a new underground 220kV powerline to the Berrybank terminal station about nine kilometres south of the wind farm.

BELOW ARE SOME EXTRACTS FROM 1934 FROM THE SKIPTON STANDARD & STREATHAM GAZETTE FROM 90 YEARS AGO LOCATED IN THE SHS POLICE HOUSE MUSEUM, MONTGOMERY STREET, SKIPTON. These extracts are researched and provided by:

Terry Gosling (Treasurer of Skipton Historical Society)

KILLS FARM PESTS.

One of the most valuable and interesting discoveries of science to-day promises to become a boon to farmers. Far too long the fertile land has lain prey to countless insects, against whose ravages the farmer has only had the feeblest means of defence. But owing to the work of a group of scientists the farmer in the future will only have to put a finger on a switch and every insect in his fields will be burned to death. This wonderful discovery for killing insects by wireless waves has been put into practice by the New Jersey Agricultural Experimental Station, where a machine was installed. It was found that frequencies ranging from 1,000,000 to 3,000,000 cycles a second destroyed every sort of beetle, bug, or fly in less than a minute, while most of the plants remained unharmed for as long at 80 Actually to destroy the minutes. plants the frequency had to be raised to 20,000,000 cycles a second. Therefore a large margin of safety is assured, and a number of farms in the United States are proposing to instal sets capable of dealing death to insects within an area of one square mile. Experiments have proved that wireless waves can be used with equal success to kill the eggs of insects which make their home in stored corn. and further experiments in irridating orchards resulted in a 50 per cent. reduction in the fruit injury caused by the codlin moth.

HOW WE OBTAIN COLORS.

Animal, vegetable, and mineral substances all figure in the manufacture of artists' paints. Carmine and purple and crimson lakes are obtained from the cochineal insect. Sap-green is the juice extracted from buckthorn berries. Cobalt blue, Naples yellow, Venetian red, yellow ochre, umber, sienna and vermilion are of mineral origin; and carbon black, as might be expected, is woody fibre carbonised.

Compounded of silica, aluminium, soda, and sulphur, ultramarine was once made from the precious lapis lazuli; gamboge is the resinous gum of a Siamese tree; and lamp-black, as the name suggests, is the sooty deposit obtained by the imperfect combustion of resins and oils.

Bistre is an extract of beechwood root; Prussian blue is a ferro-cyanide of iron; madder comes from the root of a plant which grows in Turkey and Japan. Strangest product of all, however, is sepia, which is the dark fluid discharged by the cuttle-fish, a sort of liquid smoke-screen under cover of which the creature makes its escape when pursued.







Eligible residents and ratepayers are urged to check they are enrolled to vote for the upcoming local council elections by 4 pm Wednesday 7 August.

Electoral Commissioner, Sven Bluemmel, has issued a call ahead of the enrolment deadline: 'If you're 18 or over and you live in or pay rates to a Victorian council, enrol and have your say on the future of your local council.'

Australian citizens who have recently turned 18 or changed address can enrol or update their details online at vec.vic.gov.au/enrolment

Anyone on the state electoral roll is automatically enrolled for their current address for these elections. There are also additional council enrolment categories for non-resident owners, occupiers, company nominees and non-Australian citizens who pay rates.

The rules for council enrolment have changed. Property owners who don't live in the council area but may be eligible to vote because they pay rates should contact their local council for further information.

The 2024 Victorian local council elections will be the state's largest single election program, with a predicted 4.7 million voters participating in 465 individual elections across 78 councils.

Moira Shire Council is under administration and will not have a general election this October.

Further information on enrolment is available by calling 131 832 or at <u>vec.vic.gov.au</u>, where voters can also sign up to the free VoterAlert service to receive important election reminders by SMS and email.
