

Drop-in sessions to help older residents

Friendly faces are out and about in the Corangamite community, helping older residents access the services they need.

Corangamite Shire Council's Positive Ageing & Inclusion team are visiting libraries across the Shire.

"So far we have been to Camperdown, Cobden, Derrinallum and Skipton," Service Navigation Support Officer Lesa Best said.

Two more visits are planned for each of those towns, in August and September.

"We are having a great time meeting our wonderful senior residents and sharing information on the assistance that is available to them," Ms Best said.

"A whole range of aged care and assessment services are provided by a range of different organisations across the Shire.

"At times that might be confusing or intimidating but we're here to help our residents get the support they need."

Ms Best said the team could help residents

- understand the aged care system including eligibility, access, assessment and how to find a service provider;
- link in with other agencies including social services, health and community participation opportunities;
- join in with active aging programs and activities to keep them healthy, active and connected; and
- access food relief.

"We can also link carers to support services and networks, and advocate for the community," Ms Best said.

"Getting to know our residents face to face means we know their needs and can advocate for our community.

Moreton Hill Wind Farm

The proposed Moreton Hill Wind Farm is located on Wadawurrung Country, about 35 kilometres southwest of Ballarat. The wind farm will have up to 62 turbines, producing enough electricity to power around 260,000 homes and prevent almost 350,000 tonnes of emissions annually.

The wind farm is proposed to connect to the electricity network via a new underground 220kV powerline to the Berrybank terminal station about nine kilometres south of the wind farm.

LOOK AFTER THE HAIR,

Children's hair needs as much care and attention as our own, but we do not always see that it gets it. Hurried combing and occasional brushing are not enough, for in their games these young heads have many experiences which do not come the way of grown-ups. Attempts to stand on the head, for instance, on a carpet, however clean, are not the best things for the scalp and hair! Dust is inevitably collected. Rough and tumble games all disorder the hair and make it untidy.

Their heads should be shampooed with a good shampoo which is not too strong, and every few weeks the hair should be treated with olive oil.

Buy each girl a pretty comb to keep in her desk at school, or in her bag, or some special place. A boy will appreciate a smart looking comb in a case to keep in his pocket. They will use these combs without persuasion if they are presented tactfully, and will take a real pride in their appearance.

HAVE YOUR SAY: TEESDALE TURTLE BEND RECREATION AND EVENTS SPACE SITE PLANS

Golden Plains Shire Council has developed site plans for Teesdale Turtle Bend Events and Recreation Space following community consultation earlier this year. Council Invites residents to have their say on the site plans from Friday 23 August until 5pm, Friday 13 September.

The site plans have been developed based on community feedback provided through the initial phase of community consultation in February 2024. Proposed upgrades include: upgrading the stage area and surrounding pathways, replace existing picnic tables with family-sized accessible tables, install a new playspace area, improve parking, upgrade the bike and skate facilities, install fitness/agility areas and increase safety around crossing points and shared path trails.

Golden Plains Shire Council Mayor Cr Brett Cunningham said the proposed upgrades in the Teesdale Turtle Bend Reserve Recreation and Events Space site plans aim to cater to a diverse range of age groups.

"Council received more than 120 responses during the initial consultation page, which goes to show how important this community space is to Teesdale residents and visitors to the area," Cr Cunningham said.

"This project aims to increase opportunities for social connection and inclusion for residents and users and will support the health and wellbeing of the Golden Plains community. Having community-endorsed site plans is an important part of advocating for State and Federal funding to make these improvements a reality," he said.


"I encourage Teesdale residents and visitors to view the plans and share your thoughts to further inform this project as it progresses."


