



The proposed Moreton Hill Wind Farm is located on Wadawurrung Country, about 35 kilometres southwest of Ballarat. The wind farm will have up to 62 turbines, producing enough electricity to power around 260,000 homes and prevent almost 350,000 tonnes of emissions annually.

The wind farm is proposed to connect to the electricity network via a new underground 220kV powerline to the Berrybank terminal station about nine kilometres south of the wind farm.

COUNCILS OPPOSE BOARD'S REFUSAL

The Hampden Spire Council has received a circular letter from the municipal clerk at Hamilton requesting co-operation in opposing the policy of the Transport Regulation Board in refusing licences to service motor cars carrying pas engers and motor trucks carrying goods, which may compete with railway traffic.

The reasons for opposition are that service cars are a modern means of transport, which, by reason of their speed, comfort and mobility serve a useful purpose in enabling travellers to save time and money when travelling from outlying parts of the State to Melbourne; and that motor trucks save double handling of goods, enabling the producer to have his produce carted and delivered to its destination by the one car-It is further claimed that service cars and trucks contribute towards the cost of road maintenance by the fees charged for registration.

The circular suggess that the Railways should meet the motor competition by an adjusment of freights and tares rather than seeking the exclusion of commercial motor traffic from the roads






