## **PYRENEES SHIRE COULCIL NEWS**

Pyrenees Shire councillors recognized for years of service at this year's Municipal Association of Victoria's (MAV) Councillor Service Awards, three of Pyrenees Shire's councillors have been recognized for their ongoing service to the community.

The Councillor Services Awards celebrate the achievements, commitment, and dedication of long-serving councillors across the state. ## **HAVE YOUR SAY**

Have your say on the draft Beaufort Linear Masterplan The Beaufort Linear Masterplan is closer to completion after many different activities and meetings held with the community since the start of September.

"The Beaufort Linear Masterplan will help guide us in creating a loved and well used space for our community," Pyrenees Shire Council Mayor Cr Ron Eason said. After a series of catch ups with schools, service clubs, community groups, traditional custodians; visits to retailers; surveys; workshops; pop-up events; site walks; and face to face meetings, the feedback received from the community is being used to develop the draft masterplan.

"I am pleased to see people giving their feedback on the draft Masterplan. It's an important document and we want to make sure that we're incorporating our community' needs and wishes now and into the future for this project," Cr Eason said.

During the final stages of developing the masterplan, community members are invited to view and comment on the draft masterplan at the Beeripmo Centre Wednesday 1 November from 6pm. Feedback from the community at this drop in event will be used to write the final version of the plan.

"With the final draft ready, it's important for community members to take this opportunity to make sure their thoughts and ideas have been incorporated into the document and to make sure that they're happy with the direction the plan is taking. We're looking forward to delivering this plan and meeting the community's needs with it," Cr Eason said.

The masterplan will include concept plans for the future design of the project area. The draft plan can be viewed between 6pm and 7.30pm on the night. Council will be providing light refreshments for community members. All are welcome and there is no need to book. # Fire restrictions announced for Northern Grampians

The Fire Danger Period (FDP) will begin at 1.00am on Monday, 6 November for the Northern Grampians Shire.

The El Niño weather pattern means Victorians can expect a hotter and drier summer than recent years, and communities should begin preparing their properties and creating a Bushfire Survival Plan.

CFA District 16 Assistant Chief Fire Officer Bernie Fradd said while local grass loads are still relatively green and benign it only takes a few warm days for grass to dry off enough to become a fire hazard.

"With September and October having historically low rainfall it is important that people take care while clearing up around their property," ACFO Fradd said.

While CFA's 52,000 members are poised to respond and support communities this bushfire season, they're urging people to use common sense and take responsibility for preventing fires.

Residents in Northern Grampians Shire are asked to take this opportunity ahead of the FDP to clean up their properties and for landowners to conduct safe private burn-offs where possible.

Those conducting burn-offs must notify authorities online at the Fire Permits Victoria website (www.firepermits.vic.gov.au), or by calling ESTA on 1800 668 511.

By registering your burn-off online, you allow emergency call takers to allocate more of their time taking calls from people who need emergency assistance immediately.

No burning off is permitted during the FDP without a Permit to Burn, which can be applied for through the Fire Permits Victoria website.

There are very strict conditions attached to these permits and the liability sits with the permit holder to ensure they always act safely.

#### Fire Danger Period information:

- A written permit is required to burn off grass, undergrowth, weeds or other vegetation during the FDP. You can apply for a permit at firepermits.vic.gov.au. It can also be issued by the Municipal Fire Prevention Officer or the CFA District Office.
- Lighting fires in the open without a permit can bring a penalty of more than \$21,800 and/or 12 months imprisonment. For a full list of conditions, visit cfa.vic.gov.au/can.
